INTRODUCTION: WHAT IS U-REPORT?

- A digital real-time youth engagement, communication and data collection platform
- A tool for young people to speak out on issues they care about
- A tool that can bring young people and governments closer together
- Free and anonymous
- Accessed through SMS, Facebook Messenger, Viber, WhatsApp, Instagram, etc.
- Transparent, results available online and in real time: https://pacific.ureport.in/
- Worldwide, over 22 million young people are members and growing
- More than 90 Countries and more in the pipeline

METHODS

- Ministries of Health, Education, Youth and Sports together with UNICEF and Youth Challenge Vanuatu working together on U-Report in Vanuatu.
- **1274 U-Reporters** in Vanuatu to date (716 female, 557 male)
- Polls/mini surveys developed to assess perceptions across sectors health, nutrition, WASH, education, child protection, economic empowerment, climate action, etc.
- 3 Health related polls developed to date:
 - Covid 19 Stigma
 - Covid 19 (Adolescent vaccination)
 - HPV vaccine Underway

ACTIONS

- Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) developed which focused on side effects and vaccine safety
- Integrated into parent and adolescent engagement modules delivered by the Health Promotion Unit Risk Communication Community Engagement (RCCE) team
- Adolescent vaccination brochure including side effects, aftercare of side effects





DISCUSSION & RECOMMENDATIONS / IMPLICATIONS

- Highlights the importance of using data and evidence to inform Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE) activities/key messages – need to keep doing this
- Importance of linkages between RCCE and operations to ensure data is shared and leads to timely action
- Opportunity to continue strengthening youth engagement so they have a voice in decision making
