# NO MORE LEAKS

INNOVATIVE WAYS TO MANAGE INCONTINENCE DURING AND AFTER A DISASTER

### BACKGROUND



- Incontinence is the uncontrolled leaking of urine or feces
- Increases during and after stressful events such as disasters







25% of people in Vanuatu have reportedly experienced incontinence

33% of people with disabilities in Vanuatu reported experiencing urinary or fecal incontinence, 3 times a week or <u>more</u> 50% of people did not know of, or use any, products to help manage their incontinence











### METHOD

Data collected through pre and post training surveys with Village Health Workers

Key informant interviews with a purposive sample of the 230 individual people with disabilities or family members provided with the training in Sanma, Torba and Shefa Provinces.



"Thanks to the Leftemap Laef Program, I can do things quicker and better so I don't need my granddaughter to stay at home with me all day...

Now I can often go outside and she can go to school in the mornings while I look after myself.

She was happy to be able to go back to school and be with her friends..."

### RESULTS

#### BIFO YU KAM LONG TRENING - Wanem save blong yu long topic long Disabiliti?

TYPE: "SELECT\_ONE". 14 out of 14 respondents answered this question. (0 were without data.)



#### AFTA YU KAM LONG TRENING - Wanem save blong yu long topic long Disabiliti?

TYPE: "SELECT\_ONE". 14 out of 14 respondents answered this question. (0 were without data.)



### 100% of participants reported having an increased understanding of disability





### RESULTS

### BIFO YU KAM LONG TRENING - Wanem save blong yu long topic long Inkontinens?

### DISCUSSION

- 100% increase in understanding of disability
- 96% increase in awareness of assistive devices and understanding how to provide respectful and dignified care for a person experiencing incontinence, both during and after a disaster.
