Event Overview

On 23-24 September 2021, the 2nd Vanuatu Health Research Symposium was held at Holiday Inn in Port Vila.

The Symposium Organising Committee was chaired by Dr Vincent Atua and Dr Lawrence Boe (on behalf of the Vanuatu Medical and Dental Association).

A symposium organising committee comprised of Dr Matthew Cornish (private physician), Dr Tessa Knox (WHO), Yohann Lemonnier (VHP) and Dr Caroline van Gemert (VHP).

The program is presented in the appendix of this report. The Symposium included a total of 36 presentation including 25 oral presentations and 11 posters.
