The purpose of this document is to provide an update on the situation and actions taken to address malaria outbreaks and low vaccination coverage in Vanuatu. **Note that information from additional provinces and full data from Shefa province will be available in subsequent Situation Reports.**

SUMMARY OF KEY ACTIVITIES

- On 11 July 2022, the Vanuatu Ministry of Health declared outbreaks of malaria in certain areas and in late May 2022 noted the critical issue of low childhood vaccination rates.
- A rapid integrated response was mounted. In Sanma province, this included use of the HELPR-1 vessel from Respond Global for rapid access to rural and remote areas of Santo Island and Malekula Island.
- For the malaria response, 51 villages were visited in the reporting period with 29 in Malekula. Four (4) new case of malaria were detected for a total of 145 cases in Malampa, 245 cases in Santo and an unknown total in Epi Island since the beginning of 2022.
- Key activities undertaken to address the malaria outbreaks in and around confirmed cases and in known active foci included: case investigations, retrospective DOT/primaquine issuance, RDT screening, distribution of LLINs, indoor residual spraying, and delivery of key messages.
- Childhood immunization activities – especially for a rapid increase in measles immunization rates – were also conducted.
- A total of 39 villages were visited with 1,541 children presenting for vaccination and 2,995 vaccines administered to children across SANMA, MALEKULA and SHEFA provinces (Epi Island).

HEALTH OPERATIONS & RESPONSE ACTIONS

The below provides a brief overview of the situation and summary for the reporting period. Detailed information on confirmed malaria cases is provided through monthly malaria line lists and case investigation forms, with data entered into DHIS-2 by provincial teams.

HELPR1 did not have a malaria team onboard for the Malekula operation though malaria teams were separately deployed throughout the island.

Malaria

The below provides a brief overview of the situation and summary for the reporting period. Detailed information on confirmed malaria cases is provided on monthly malaria line lists and case investigation forms. A running total is being compiled by the National Malaria and Other Vector Borne Diseases Control Program. The below focusses on two provinces, with reports on cases and response activities to be provided in full for Shefa and also for Torba in a subsequent report.
